It is meant to guide social work practice.


It is **aspirational**.

A new core value:

Respecting the Dignity and Worth of All People
Promoting Social Justice
Pursuing Truth and Reconciliation
Valuing Human Relationships
Preserving Integrity in Professional Practice
Maintaining Privacy and Confidentiality
Providing Competent Professional Services

Each value is accompanied by Guiding Principles, Context for Practice statements, and Guidelines.

NO VALUE STANDS IN ISOLATION

	Guiding Principles define the parameters for expected ethical behaviour and align with the value.
+	Context for Practice statements supplement each Guiding Principle and provide additional information on how principles are to be applied in practice.
↓ ↑	Guidelines align with the Context for Practice statements and describe specific behaviours that support guiding principles for ethical practice.


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Main changes from 2005 – 2024:
